How to Take Smart Notes in Obsidian

Setting up Obsidian

- 1. Create a "Vault" to store the data in
- 2. Use "Daily Notes" to capture day to day fleeting notes
- 3. Create a reference folder to capture literature notes
- 4. Create a "Slip-Box" folder for permanent notes
- 5. Create a "Projects" folder to store project information

Adding Notes to the Slip-Box

Difference between Physical Slip Box and Obsidian

In the physical version, adding Smart Notes goes as follows:

- 1. Add the note directly behind the note being referenced. Or add the note behind the last note and number with the next available ID.
- 2. Add links to other notes or from other notes to your new note.
- 3. Add the note directly to the index or to a note that is already connected to the index.

In Obsidian these steps are slightly modified as follows:

- 1. Add the note directly behind the note being referenced by starting or continuing a sequence.
- 2. Add note-to-note links on or from related notes
- 3. Add a link to the note directly on the index or from a note already connected to the index

Begin A Sequence

- Cluster Notes in logical sequences
- Name them with numbers (1, 2, 3)
- If fitting notes between others, use letters (8, 8a, 8b)
- Don't use a top-down categorical hierarchy

Add Links to existing Notes

- Make connections to existing Notes
- Link them to others adding sequences
- Add links and backlinks to create connections

Index the Note

- Index = Entry Point to the notes
- Use only few Keywords to indicate the topics of the notes
- Select Keywords so that you find them in the context you need them
- Add Secondary Structure Notes
 - Cluster Notes from different topics together.
 - Keep the Structure Note in the index and use the structure note as an index fot the deeper topic.

Navigating the Notes

- Only use Keywords for Index and Structure Notes
- Any other note only gets an ID
- Use Browsing instead of Searching for Notes
